This class provides an opportunity for you to learn how to help yourself and your paddling friends whenever you run into trouble on the river.

This course will be taught by Swiftwater Rescue trained instructors. Students will need to have some basic comfort with their paddling skills ON WHITEWATER before embarking on the training. A roll is not necessary in order to take this class.

Whitewater boats (no recreational boats), or Whitewater Canoes are required for this course.

Join us at the Hiwassee / Ocoee Scenic River State Park located at: 404 Spring Creek Road, Delano, Tennessee on the Hiwassee River.

This school is for beginner whitewater canoe and kayak paddlers up to advanced paddlers ages 12 and up.

Instructional opportunities will include on and off-river lessons covering orientation and logistics; terminology and river signals; stroke work, self and assisted rescue; fundamentals of river features; whitewater practice such as eddy turns, ferries and surfing; assessing current environmental conditions; and paddling group dynamics. On-water instruction is based on skill level. We look forward to seeing you there!

#### **TSRA Supports First Annual Row'n The River Race**

The Roaring River flows through Jackson County and empties into the Cumberland River just north of Downtown Gainesboro, our county seat. In the early 1900s, Gainesboro was a main port for steamboats traveling up and down the Cumberland River. Since then, our river has seen a good variety of bass fishing, but not as much recreational boating due to the river not being easily accessible.

We only have a handful of launching points for boats due to the silt/sludge that develops throughout the seasons. With the lack of boat launches, we have seen a great decline in the enjoyment of one of Jackson County's greatest natural assets- our river. Our hope is to create experiences or events that bring people back to the river. With newfound excitement and drive, we plan to provide more access points for kayaks and SUPs to launch from. Row'n the River Race was formed from this hope.

The race will take place on <u>July 15th</u>. The competitive 6 mile race will begin at 8:00am while the "fun float" will begin 2 miles down river at 9:00am. The competitive race's route will take you through small rapids and around some obstacles, some of which are simply rock bars. While the fun float will be on a much wider (but deeper) leg of the river.
